INTRODUCTION

The following vision, as defined in the Community Environmental and Natural Resources Policy Framework, is intended to help guide the actions up to and beyond 2020:

To effectively and sustainably manage the Community's environmental, natural and cultural resources, including creating and improving conditions necessary for the conservation of nature, and maintaining the ecological balance to capitalize on the benefits that will accrue from their optimal utilization, thereby contributing to the balanced economic, environmental and social development of the Community as a whole and its Member States.

This, the First Action Plan of the Caribbean Community Environmental and Natural Resources Policy Framework (hereafter referred to as the Policy Framework) is the first step in making the Policy Framework actionable. As its title suggests, it provides a basis for a collective response by the Caribbean Community and its Member States to the environmental and sustainable development revolution, which is underscored by the adopting by the international community of the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) and the 2030 Sustainable Development Agenda. It also provides a context for the Community and its Member States to take action, which contributes to the attainment of, sustained, inclusive and sustainable growth and development.

The integrated and coherent development and implementation of the Community Environmental and Natural Resources Policy Framework will enable the economy and society of the Community and its Member States to be better prepared to face the myriad of environmental and natural resources issues facing them. It shall, therefore, lead to a more systematic and complementary approach to the management of the Community and its Member States environmental and natural resources. It should, however, be noted that not all the issues specified in the Policy Framework will be implemented under one Action Plan and time frame. Instead implementation of the issues highlighted in the Policy Framework will be implemented on a phased basis, over time.

The First Action Plan Period (July 2017 to June 2022) will have as its focus a number of strategic thematic objectives, which places emphasis on the building, and strengthening of the policy, technical and institutional and the education and awareness infrastructure, necessary for the effective implementation of the Policy Framework. Action will, therefore, be centered on ten thematic objectives namely:



- To protect, conserve and enhance the Community's [terrestrial] natural resources:
- 2. To promote and support management strategies for the conservation and sustainable use of the Community's ocean, marine and coastal resources:
- To establish mechanisms to facilitate the implementation of the Policy Framework by a wide cross-section of the Community's stakeholders, at all levels;
- 4. To strengthen resilience and adaptive capacity of the Community to climate-related hazards, natural and maninduced disasters:
- To strengthen the interface between trade and environment, including strengthening the Community's capacity to comply with international environmental, health and safety standards, thereby, contributing to international competitiveness;
- To promote sustainable consumption and production patterns [including increasing the use of clean energy as a basis for transitioning the economies of the Member States to embrace low carbon, green and/or organic principles];
- 7. Development of Special Programmes;
- 8. Support for the implementation of multilateral environmental agreement to which the Member States are Parties;
- To increase the Community's effectiveness in addressing and negotiating international environmental and sustainable development issues;
- 10. To mobilise adequate levels of financing and investment from multiple sources to facilitate the implementation of the Policy Framework and its Action Plans.
