2 Objective/Overview of the Programme

CARPHA's mission is to provide strategic direction, in analysing, defining and responding to public health priorities of Member States, in order to prevent disease, promote health and to respond to public health emergencies. CARPHA supports solidarity in health, as one of the principal pillars of functional cooperation, in the Caribbean Community.

This position supervises the day to day activities of the maintenance assistants. Performs scheduled preventive maintenance tasks including maintaining and monitoring electrical systems.

4 Summary of Responsibilities

1. Assigns and supervises the day-to-day duties of maintenance assistants.
2. Ensures adherence to Occupational Safety and Health protocols and measures across all maintenance activities.
3. Assists with the training of staff to carry out maintenance in the BSL.
4. Receives requests for laboratory support services, assigns tasks and follows up as appropriate.
5. Coordinates weekend duties for maintenance staff as necessary.
6. Monitors scheduled preventive maintenance tasks and updates maintenance records on the following equipment: High Voltage Test for Kiosk, Water softener, Emergency Generators, Water coolers, Cold Room
7. Maintains and monitors electrical systems, and carries out electrical installations, when necessary
8. Assists with the control of maintenance stores and the distribution of supplies.
9. Performs analysis of preventive maintenance records, work request/projects and provide report on findings
10. Troubleshoots and repairs electronic equipment.
11. Monitors the state of the buildings for any structural damage.
12. Assists in alerting staff about the safety risk to self and equipment.
13. Alerts management to perimeter breaches or potential breaches.
14. Acts as Project Officer on building, electrical and other maintenance projects.
15. Provides leadership, training and 'hands-on' support in the performance/execution of the basic maintenance crafts.
16. Represents the supervisor at meetings, when necessary, and ensures that all technical work is carried out during his/her absence.
17. Assists in the maintenance of all tools and equipment pertaining to basic maintenance craft.
18. Participates in conducting site visits for contractual works.
19. Assists in the provision of job estimates, when requested, participates in budget preparation for the Maintenance Department.
20. Collaborates with the Supervisor to evaluate the performance of maintenance assistants and recommends appropriate programmes for their development.
21. Manages the equipment inventory for Maintenance & keep records on trouble shooting and scheduled maintenance.
22. Performs other related duties as necessary.
